BASIC RULES

Arena Director and Judges have the final say on any disputes. Arena Dragging will be deemed necessary by management. All events count towards All Around except PeeWee Boot Race. No Ground Splits IF YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ASK BEFORE RODEO/EVENT OR AT THE GROUNDS MEETING

Anyone in Arena MUST be in full western attire (hat, cowboy boots, pants, long sleeve shirt and long pants). The 3 call rule will be strictly observed. The contestant must be at the gate and ready to ride. Any delay will be considered a "no time", unless waived for a good reason. If contestant is up in both arenas at the same time, the main arena holds presidents. Contestant must have someone advise the other arena, and the contestant will be rolled to the bottom of the list.

ALL AROUND

Points will be based on the following: 10, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 point system. Points will be given to first through ninth place to each boy and each girl (separate points). Team events will be given points to EACH contestant on the team regardless of boy/girl and will follow High School Rodeo Rules.

In the case of a tie All Around will be determined by 1. Most money won. 2. Entered in two or more events but winning the most money in a single event.

NOTE: Ground Split money goes to the Scholarship Fund, will not be posted toward All-Around.

CALF RIDING - 6-9 - Chute run - 6 second ride and scored - Must wear protective gear – Helmet and Vest. **NO ALL-AROUND POINTS FOR NO RIDE – LONGEST RIDE WINS THE BUCKLE IF THERE ARE NO QUALIFIED RIDES**

BARREL RACING - POLE BENDING – BREAKAWAY ROPING – STEER RDING – Basic High School Rodeo rules to be used as a guideline – Girls will NOT be allowed to ride steers. Horses CAN be shared in different age groups. 6-9 kids may be lead in by a parent, and parent may stay in the arena during the run.

6-9 BREAKAWAY – NEX SLED ROPING – Will be pulled by a four-wheeler. 1 Loop and must be roped before the marker at the end of the arena. Horse's butt <u>MUST</u> be touching the back of the box before the contestant nods their head or results in 10 second penalty. Rope must be tied on and have a flag. **NO ROPE BARRIER**.

6-9 SMARTY ROPING- Sled will be pulled by a four-wheeler, 30 Second Time Limit. Heading and heeling will be done separately (no partners). Can enter both heading and heeling 1 time. 1 Loop, no rope barrier but horse's butt <u>MUST</u> be touching the back of the box before the contestant nods their head – Failure to be touching back of the box will result in 10

second penalty. **Heading:** You must have your slack pulled for time to stop, 3 legal head catches. **Heeling:** You must be dallied for time to stop. 1 leg is a 5 sec penalty.

STEER STOPPING – NO 6-9 in this event – 30 second time limit - Must face - 1 loop - legal head catch.

STEER DAUBING – 6-9 ONLY - 30 second time limit - Lift dauber in the air to call for time - must be obvious mark. Contestant's horse must touch the back corner of the box. There will be NO hazer.

TEAM ROPING – *ONLY ALLOWED 1 GO* (Junior, Senior, and Open) 3 Loops – Closed Gate – 30 seconds – Must face & be tight. Must Rope with a partner within the same age category. High School Rodeo Rules will be used as a guideline.

RIBBON ROPING – *ONLY ALLOWED* 1 *GO* - **NO** 6-9 - **Must be a Boy/Girl Team in SAME age Division** – 1 loop – 60 second time limit – **NO TIE ON'S MUST** dally and stay dallied until the ribbon is pulled off tail. – Catch as catch can – No jerk downs – Roper stays mounted – Runner will come from the start line, <u>MUST</u> wear western attire with boots - Runner pulls ribbon from the tail. Time will stop when runner gets back across the line - Points will go to each contestant. Rope calves out of the Heel Box with a Barrier.

HIDE RACE – ONLY ALLOWED 1 GO (ADULTS PULLING 6-9 YOUTH MAY ENTER WITH MULTIPLE YOUTH) 6-9 MUST BE PULLED BY AN ADULT – Adults MUST sign a Waiver and pay the \$10 Insurance Fee if they are not already entered in the rodeo. Partners must be in same age group (except 6-9) – Must sign up with a partner, NO GHOSTS. Helmets are Required for 6-19– Vest is optional - Must remain on hide when crossing start and finish- Rider must keep dallied – Points go to each contestant.

BOOT RACE

Does NOT count towards All Around Points.

STICK HORSE BARRELS

Cloverleaf barrel pattern, two rights-one left, or two lefts-one right - 5 seconds added for knocked down barrel. A disqualification if you go off pattern.

GOAT UNDECORATING

Time will start when contestant crosses the line. Contestant must take ribbon off the goat's tail and carry it back across the finish line in order for the time to stop. If contestant crosses the line without the ribbon they will receive a NO TIME.

DUMMY ROPING

- * 3 Legal Head catches (slick horns = 3 points, neck catch = 2 points, half head = 1 point)
- * Fishing is allowed but not off of the dummy's whole body.
- * Slack must be pulled tight
- * Contestant must stay behind the line; they cannot stand on the line or they will be disqualified.
- * All contestants get 3 loops. Best on 3 comes back for sudden death reach round(s).

SUDDEN DEATH REACH ROUND (S) IN CASE OF TIE

- * Sudden Death = if you miss, you are out.
- * Before each round begins, the judge will move the dummy forward 1 foot each round (after all have taken a turn).
- * Judges have final say!

MUTTON BUSTING – 5 & Under - Chute run – 6 second ride and scored pr if no qualified ride, the longest ride will be first - Must wear protective gear – Helmet and Vest.
